NFES provided:

1. year round free talks upon request on public safety subjects at meetings of resident/homeowner associations, public service clubs etc. (please see the Sept. 1985 homeshow and Oct. 1985 Native Plant Society seminar announcements).
2. telephone advise on matters of public safety affecting effective or homeowner property management.
3. testimony at the the Los Angeles County Fire Commission and the Calif. Senate subcommittee hearings on effective aerial fire fighting in California.
4. 2 taped TV interviews on effective aerial fire fighting technology, radio interviews on public safety and the services of NFES, newspaper articles on effective property management to reduce the potential of fire and flood disasters.
5. public safety literature free to members and at minimal cost to public agencies and professionals (for example the State Board of Landscape Architects made some of the publications distributed by NFES a "recommended reading" in preparation for the State Landscape Architecture tests).
6. a research report on the Baldwin Hills Fire of July 2 in Baldwin Hills, CA.
7. (donation) a public channel scanner to a local mountain resident association (Corral Canyon HOA) and encouraged other mountain HOA to buy themselves such scanners to protect themselves during fire/flood disasters etc. NFES documented fire movement and assisted the public during the 1985 Piuma and Decker fires in Malibu.
8. editing, word processing and publishing services for the book Living in the Chaparral of Southern California (An integrated approach to public safety). NFES is distributing the book free to elected officials in the County of Los Angeles (1985) and state officials (1986) while making the book available to the general public.
9. or cooperated with other public and private agencies and homeowner associations in providing all day innovate public safety seminars (see attached brochures).
10. pertinent information on its activities to members and other interested parties through newsletters etc.(see samples of newsletters).
